## **Surface**

A new spatial semiotics has rushed in the legal discourse. Yet, despite the prominent connection between law and geography, law's engagement with space is being increasingly despatialised. In this paper, I explore the potential that space has for the law. The paper has three main parts: the first deals with the connection between law and space. The second looks at the *lawscape*, namely the ontological tautology between law and space, and its atmospherics of enclosure. The third and final part looks into the emerging concept of spatial justice, which involves spatiality, temporality and materiality. On the whole, the paper aims at constructing one, continuous ontological surface on which legal foldings take place.
